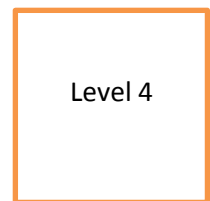
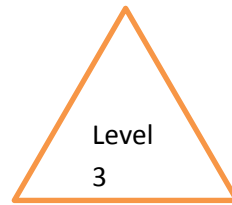




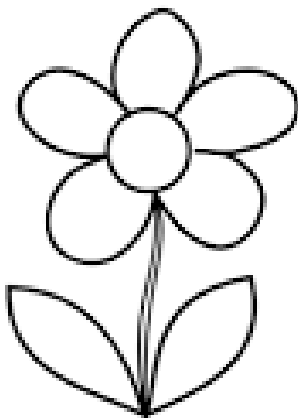
## Suggested activities to compliment Scripture and support creativity within the 'Come and See' programme


- Scripture discussion – scribbles, key phrases, setting, new words, characters etc...
- *Rules to Live By* – at home, school, parish and beyond!

- Use of visuals – art work, paintings and photographs - curator

- Venn diagrams – e.g. which of the Beatitudes would you find easy to follow / more difficult / both!
- Complete a topic web (Level 4 – challenge)
- Scripture in the middle of the book – annotate accordingly, assigning colours to; setting, moral, values, lesson, theme, new words etc....
- *Jigsaw* scripture / pictures- *scripture strips*
- *Scripture choice* activity – qualifying your choice and why!
- Use a bank of quotations from individuals such as Mother Teresa, Pope Francis, Nelson Mandela
